Checklist of the Birds of DuPage County

This checklist contains 268 species of birds that have been observed regularly in DuPage County since 2000. The checklist is arranged in accordance with the Clements checklist of the World, sixth edition, 14th supplement, V2019, released August 2019.

The checklist reflects relative abundance during seven seasons as well as breeding status.

W – Winter December 1 to February 29

ES – Early Spring March 1 to April 15

LS – Late Spring April 16 to June 5

S – Summer June 6 to July 5

PB – Post Breeding July 6 to August 15

EF – Early Fall August 16 to September 30

LF – Late Fall October 1 to November 30

B – Breeding records exist for the species and are indicated by an asterisk (*).

Primarily observed during invasion years is indicated by a (V) and abundance ratings reflect observations in invasion years.

Relative abundance is defined as follows:

A - Abundant Easy to find in large numbers on any given day in a variety of habitats.

C - Common Easy to find in good numbers on any given day in suitable habitat.

F - Fairly Common Likely to find in small numbers on most days in suitable habitat.

U - Uncommon Found in small numbers on one in four days in suitable habitat.

R - Rare Seldom found in any numbers even in suitable habitat.

X - Extremely Rare Found only in some years and only one or two occurrences in a season.
